What's it all about?

- ▶ The first of three CIVICUS World Assemblies, held at the Palais des congrès de Montréal in 2010, 2011, 2012
- ▶ A Youth Assembly, reserved for participants aged 18 to 30, will also take place before each World Assembly. Participants will also attend the World Assembly free of charge
- ▶ 800 to 1000 delegates, including 150 youths, from over 100 countries
- ▶ 6 days of activities, three of which are prepared by and exclusively for young people
- ▶ Workshops, Learning Exchanges, Interactive discussions and a Citizen's café
- ▶ Special Activities on the reconstruction of Haiti and on Citizens' media
- ▶ A live broadcast of the BBC World radio program "World Have Your Say"
- ▶ Programming in English and French

The main theme of the 2010 World Assembly is **Seeking out Solutions: Economic Justice.**

This theme will also be discussed through the lenses of the two sub-themes, **Development Effectiveness** and **Climatic Justice**, which will become the main themes of the 2011 and 2012 Assemblies.
